- **Inclusion** – We welcome and celebrate diversity, ensuring everyone has the opportunity to belong and thrive.

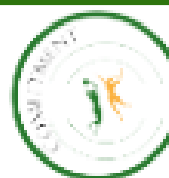

Junior Representative

Nominations, Development and Representative Teams

Nominations for the 2026 Representative Program open in November and close in January. All players who nominate will take part in the Development Program, run by our representative coaches, to help prepare for trials. Trial 1 is open to everyone, with players given the chance to trial in their nominated positions. After this, a smaller group will be invited to Trial 2, where teams are formed. Teams will be selected into Green (Division 1), Gold (Division 2), White (Division 3), and Junior Boys. Players will be notified by email and must accept their place within 24 hours.. While teams are named at this point with the intention of remaining consistent for the season, PRNA reserves the right to make changes if necessary due to clear skill discrepancies, player behaviour, or other circumstances impacting team balance and performance.

Carnivals

All junior representative teams will participate in 4–5 day or twilight carnivals across South East Queensland throughout the season. These carnivals are compulsory and provide vital preparation for the end-of-year championship event.

In 2026, Junior State Age for the Green (Division 1) and Gold (Division 2) teams will be held at Hinterland Netball Association. These teams will be required to stay together in team accommodation for the duration of the event.

There may also be additional round robin events scheduled throughout the season to provide further development opportunities. Development teams (White) will conclude their season by attending a two-day event, such as the Tigers Cup, as their end-of-year carnival.

Uniform

All Junior Representative players are required to purchase and wear the compulsory PRNA uniform items.

For female players, this includes the PRNA Playing Dress, PRNA Socks, PRNA Travel Polo, PRNA Bucket Hat, PRNA Hoodie, PRNA Bag, PRNA Training Singlet, and PRNA Training/Travel Shorts. Players may wear plain black bike shorts under the dress, provided they have no labels or logos.

Male players are required to have the PRNA Playing Singlet, PRNA Playing Shorts, PRNA Travel Polo, PRNA Bucket Hat, PRNA Hoodie, and PRNA Bag.



Junior Representative

Fees Summary – Junior Representative Program 2026

Being part of the PRNA Junior Representative Program is a commitment, and fees are structured to cover all essential costs of delivering a high-quality program.

- Nomination Fee – \$75.00
 - A one-off fee to secure your place in the trial and development process.
- Day Carnival & Representative Fee – approx. \$250.00
 - Covers carnival entries, umpire fees, administration, equipment levy, awards, and additional programs such as fitness and wellbeing sessions.
- Development Team Event Fee – approx. \$150.00
 - Covers competition entry and umpire costs for the Development Team's end-of-season carnival.
- Junior State Age Fee – approx. \$1,800.00 (Green & Gold Teams)
 - A comprehensive package that includes State Age entry fees, physiotherapy support, accommodation, team travel during the event, tent hire, ice, food, and other essentials to ensure players can focus on performance.
- **Note:** All players must be registered with their PRNA Winter Club prior to the first trial date. This covers Netball Queensland affiliation and insurance.

Senior Representative

Nominations, Development and Representative Teams

Nominations for the 2026 Senior and GBNL Representative Programs will open in September 2025 and close in October 2025. Unlike juniors, seniors do not participate in a development program.

All nominated players are required to attend the first trial in October 2025. Players will be assessed across their nominated positions, and selectors may invite a smaller group of players to a second trial if required.

Following trials, successful players will be contacted by email and must confirm their acceptance within 24 hours. Training for senior and GBNL teams will begin in January 2026.

Carnivals

Senior Representative teams will participate in 3 day and twilight carnivals in the lead-up to State Age. These carnivals provide valuable opportunities for players to refine their skills, build combinations, and compete against strong opposition in preparation for the main event.

The season will run over a 12-week period, culminating in the Netball Queensland Senior State Age Championships in Townsville, April 2026. Attendance at all scheduled carnivals is compulsory for selected players, as they form an integral part of team development and preparation.

Uniforms

All Senior Representative players are required to purchase and wear the compulsory PRNA uniform items.

For female players, this includes the PRNA Playing Dress, PRNA Socks, PRNA Travel Polo, PRNA Bucket Hat, PRNA Hoodie, PRNA Bag, PRNA Training Singlet, and PRNA Training/Travel Shorts. Players may wear plain black bike shorts under the dress, provided they have no labels or logos.

For male players, this includes the PRNA Playing Singlet, PRNA Playing Shorts, PRNA Travel Polo, PRNA Bucket Hat, PRNA Hoodie, and PRNA Bag.

Nominations, Development and Representative Teams

Nominations for the 2026 Greater Brisbane Netball League (GBNL) Program will open in September 2025 and close in November 2025.

All nominated players are required to attend two trials. Players will be assessed across their nominated positions, and selectors may invite a smaller group of players to the second trial if required.

Following trials, successful players will be contacted by email and must confirm their acceptance within 24 hours. Training for GBNL teams will begin in February 2026.

Carnivals

Where opportunities arise, GBNL teams may attend a carnival or participate in preparation lead-up games to support performance and readiness for their season.

Uniforms

All GBNL players are required to purchase and wear the compulsory PRNA uniform items. This includes the PRNA Playing Dress, PRNA Socks, PRNA Travel Polo, PRNA Hoodie, PRNA Bag, PRNA Training Singlet, and PRNA Training/Travel Shorts. Players may wear plain black bike shorts under the dress, provided they have no labels or logos.

Please note: In 2026, PRNA will be purchasing all GBNL playing dresses for players. Players will be responsible for purchasing all other compulsory items.

Uniforms

All players are required to purchase and wear the compulsory PRNA uniform items.

For female players, this includes the PRNA Playing Dress, PRNA Socks, PRNA Travel Polo, PRNA Bucket Hat, PRNA Hoodie, PRNA Bag, PRNA Training Singlet, and PRNA Training/Travel Shorts. Players may wear plain black bike shorts under the dress, provided they have no labels or logos.

For male players, this includes the PRNA Playing Singlet, PRNA Playing Shorts, PRNA Travel Polo, PRNA Bucket Hat, PRNA Hoodie, and PRNA Bag.

- **Note:** Players will need to pay the Netball QLD fee for insurance . This only needs to be paid if the player hasnt registered with Netball Queensland for any other competition.
